Indicate the running head in the lower case and the shortened title of the paper (<= 50 char.) typed in capital letters.

Start numbering the pages from the first page.

Title of the Paper

First name, Middle name (as an initial) and the Last name of the author

Title of the University

Provide the title of the paper (in title case), author's name, and the educational institution.

Sometimes the date may also be required.

Set the margins to 1 inch on all sides. The entire paper should be double spaced unless required otherwise.

References

List the references of a separate page. Label it with the word "References" (always plural regardless of the number of sources).

An article in a collection of articles.

An article published on a website.

An article from a scholarly journal. Add DOI or URL if the article is available online.

Use hanging indentation for each entry. Double space all of them and list them in the alphabetical order.

Titles of books and articles are normally presented in sentence case, while titles of periodicals are typed in title case.
